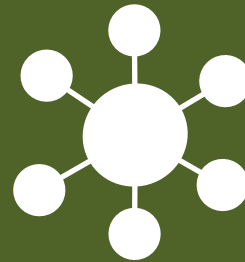

People working together to solve a problem.

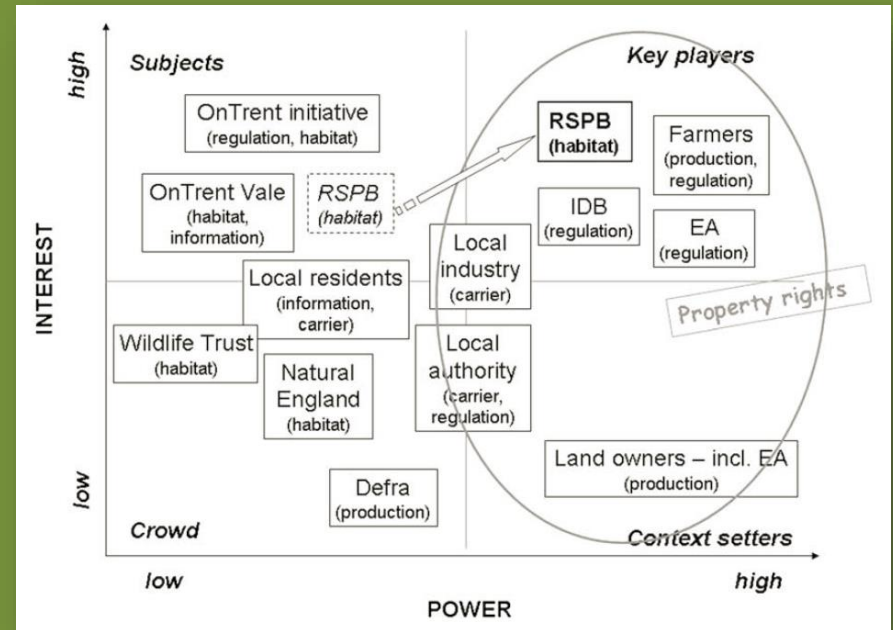


Dysfunctional conflict is *interrelationship-focused*.

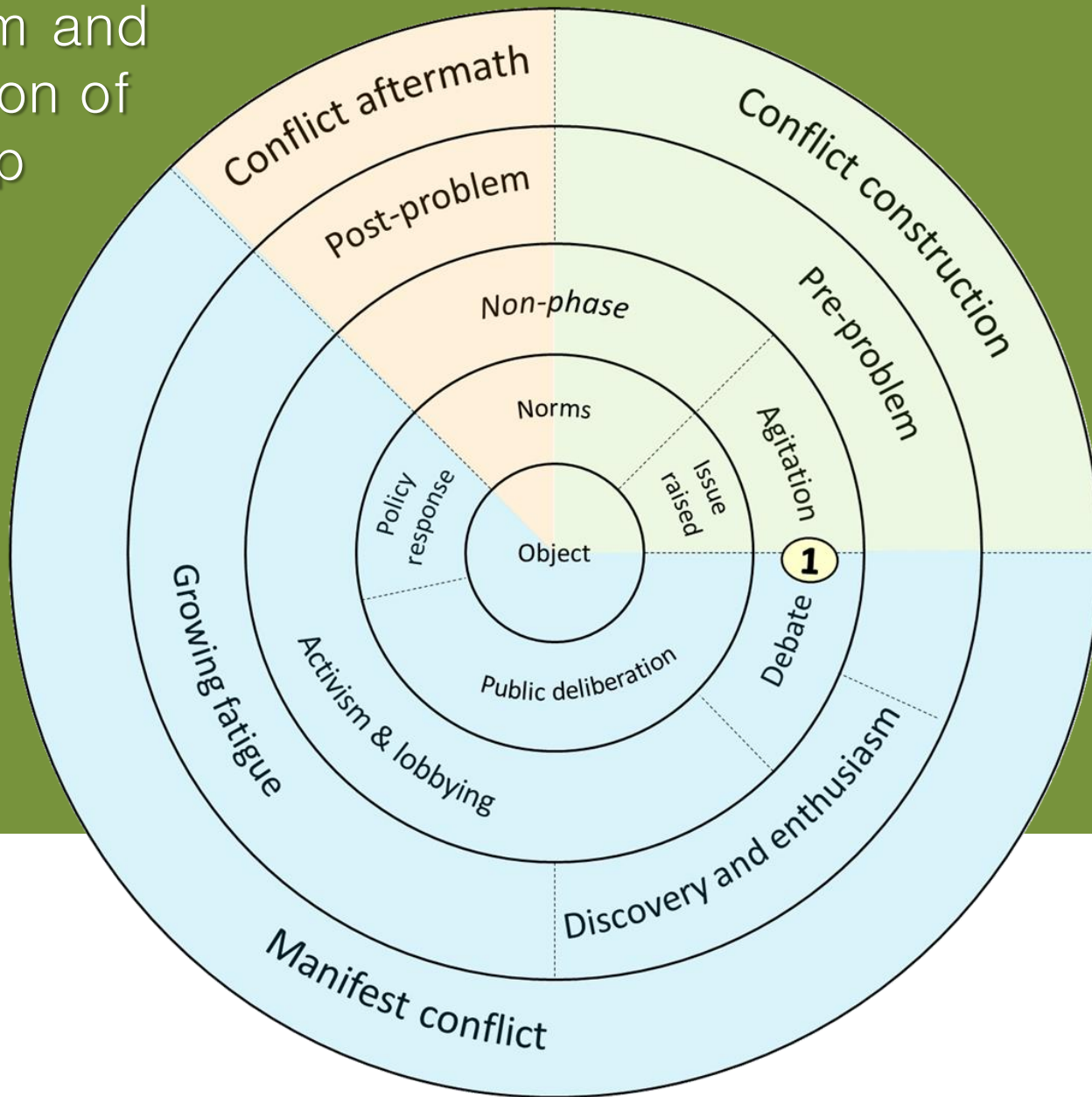

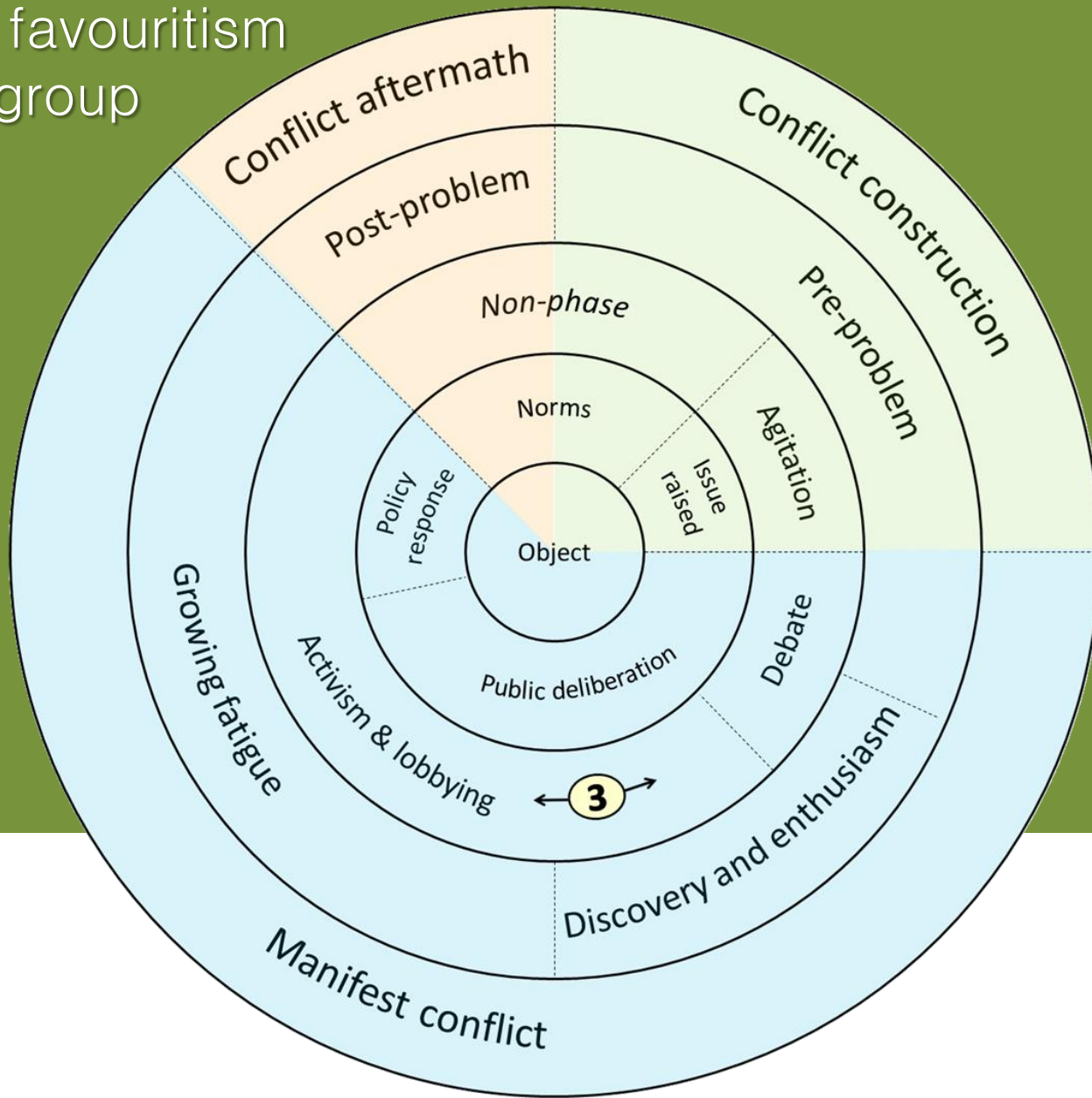

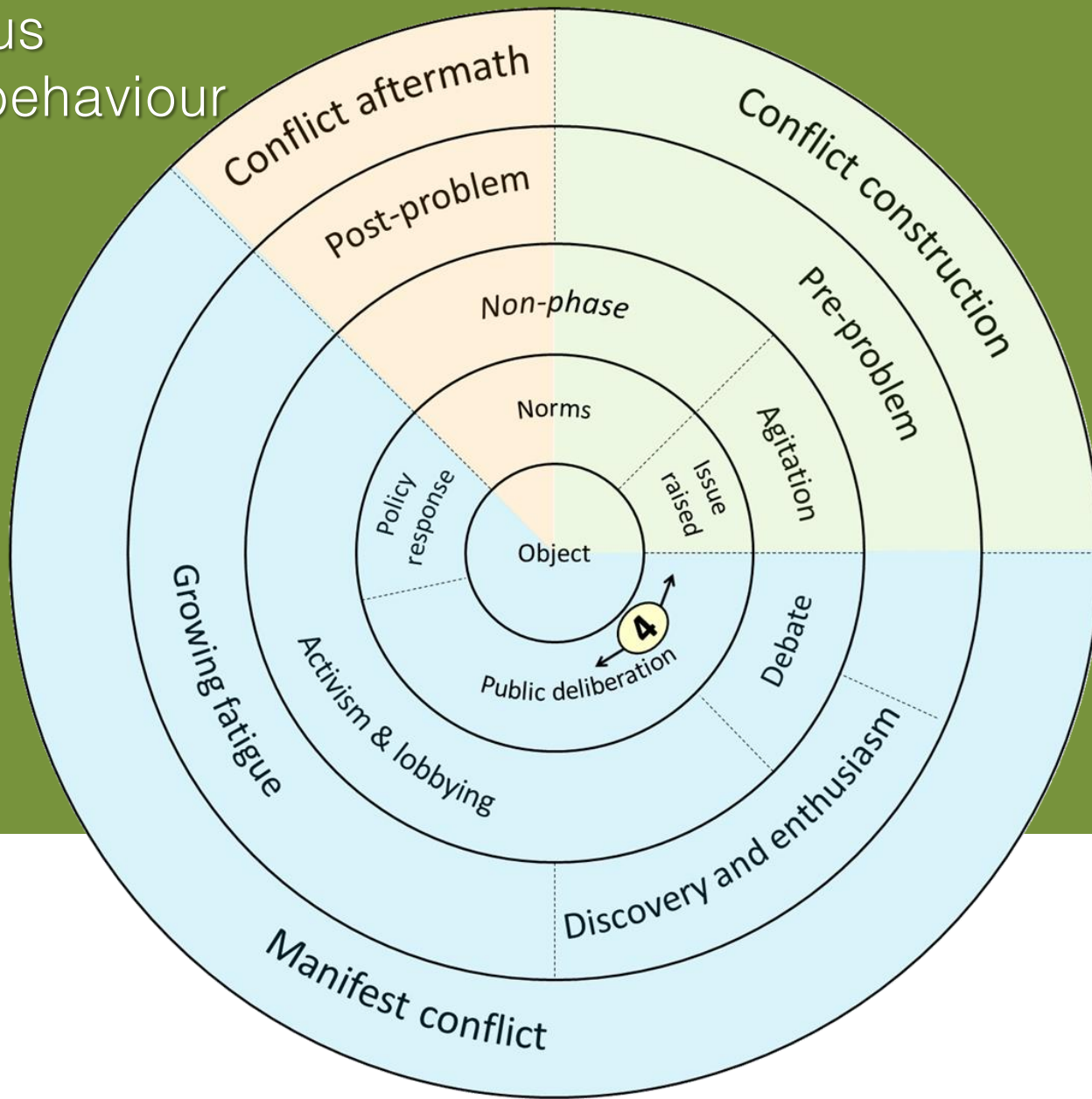

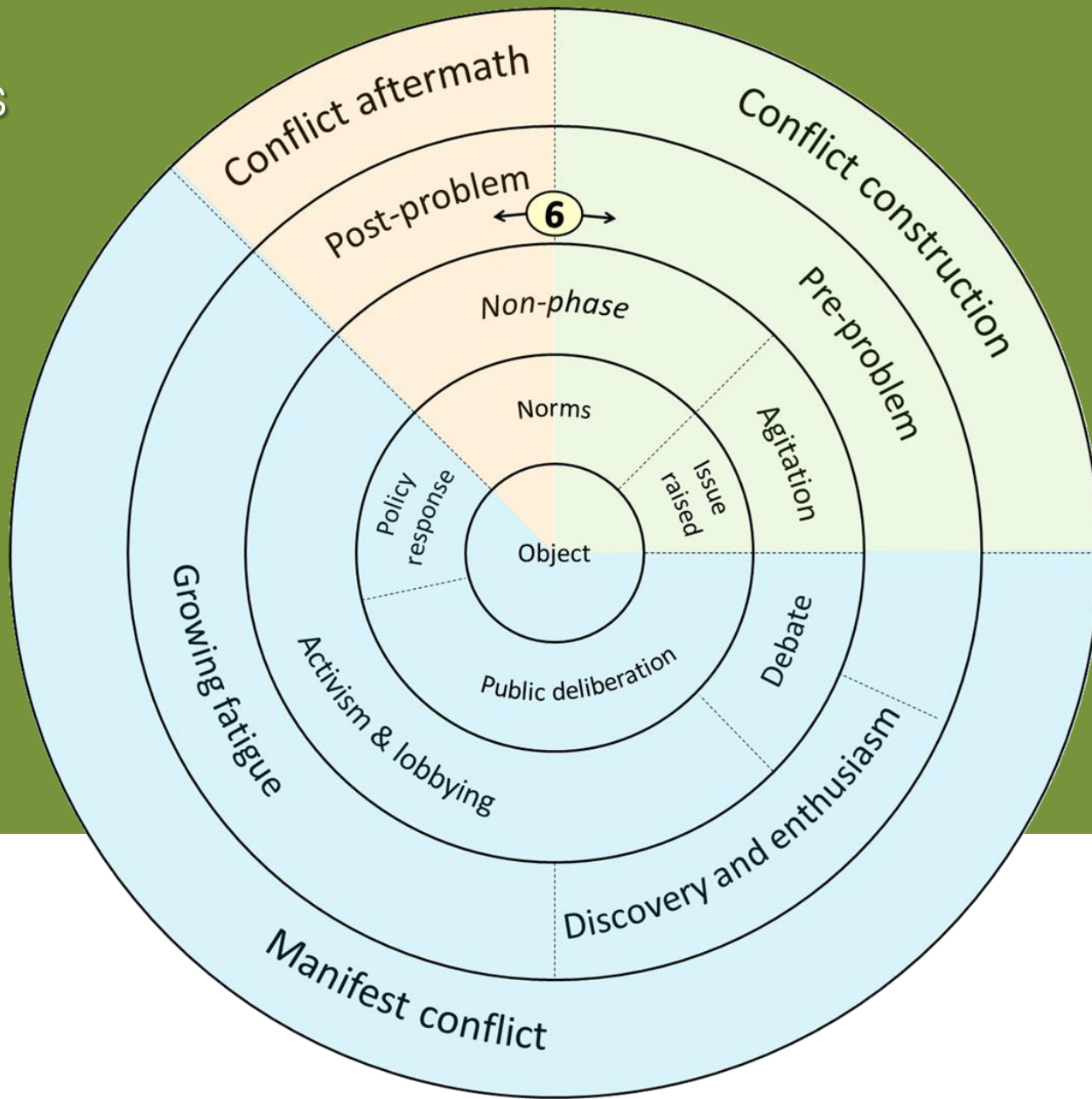
Consensus seeking behaviour



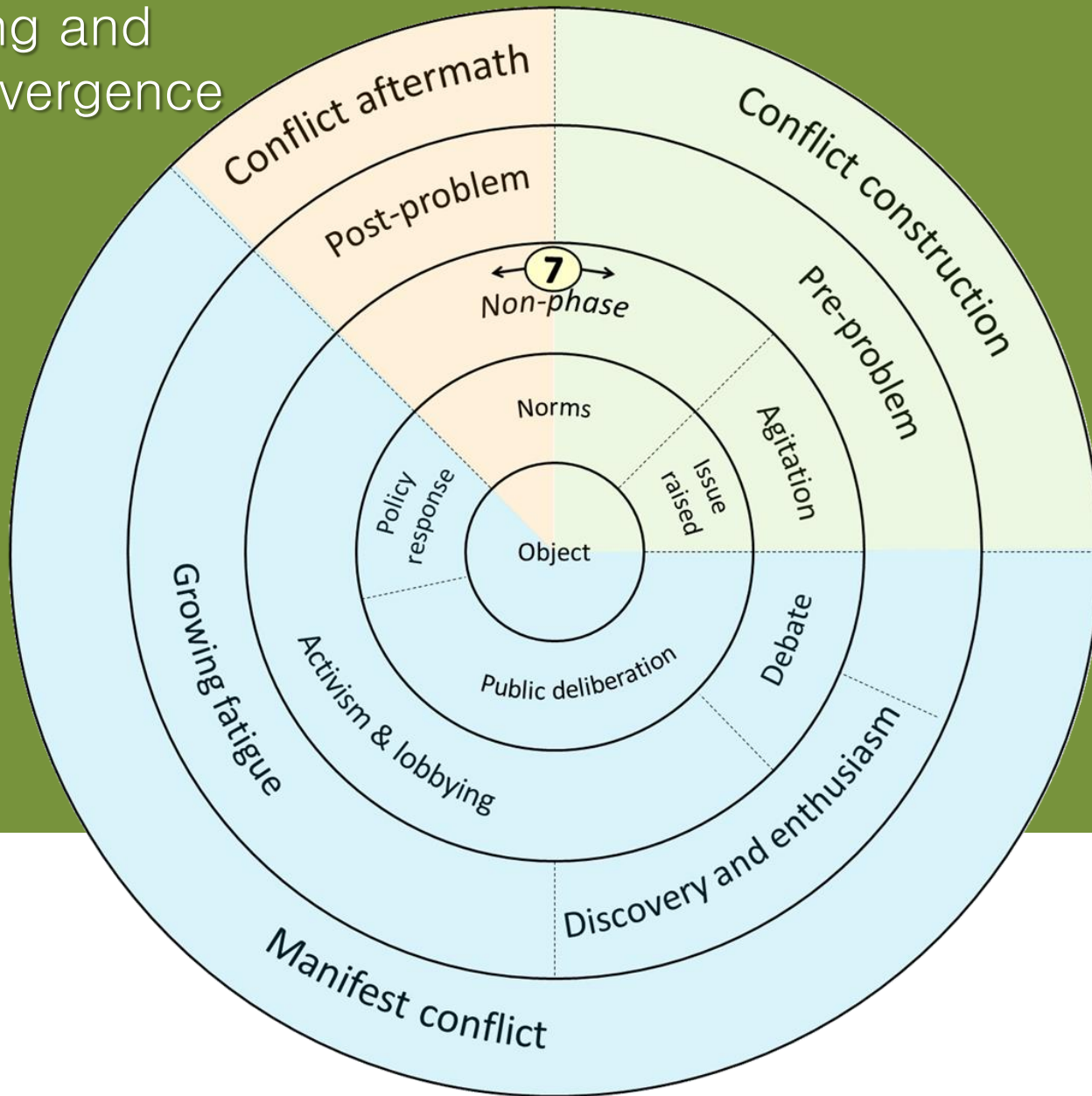

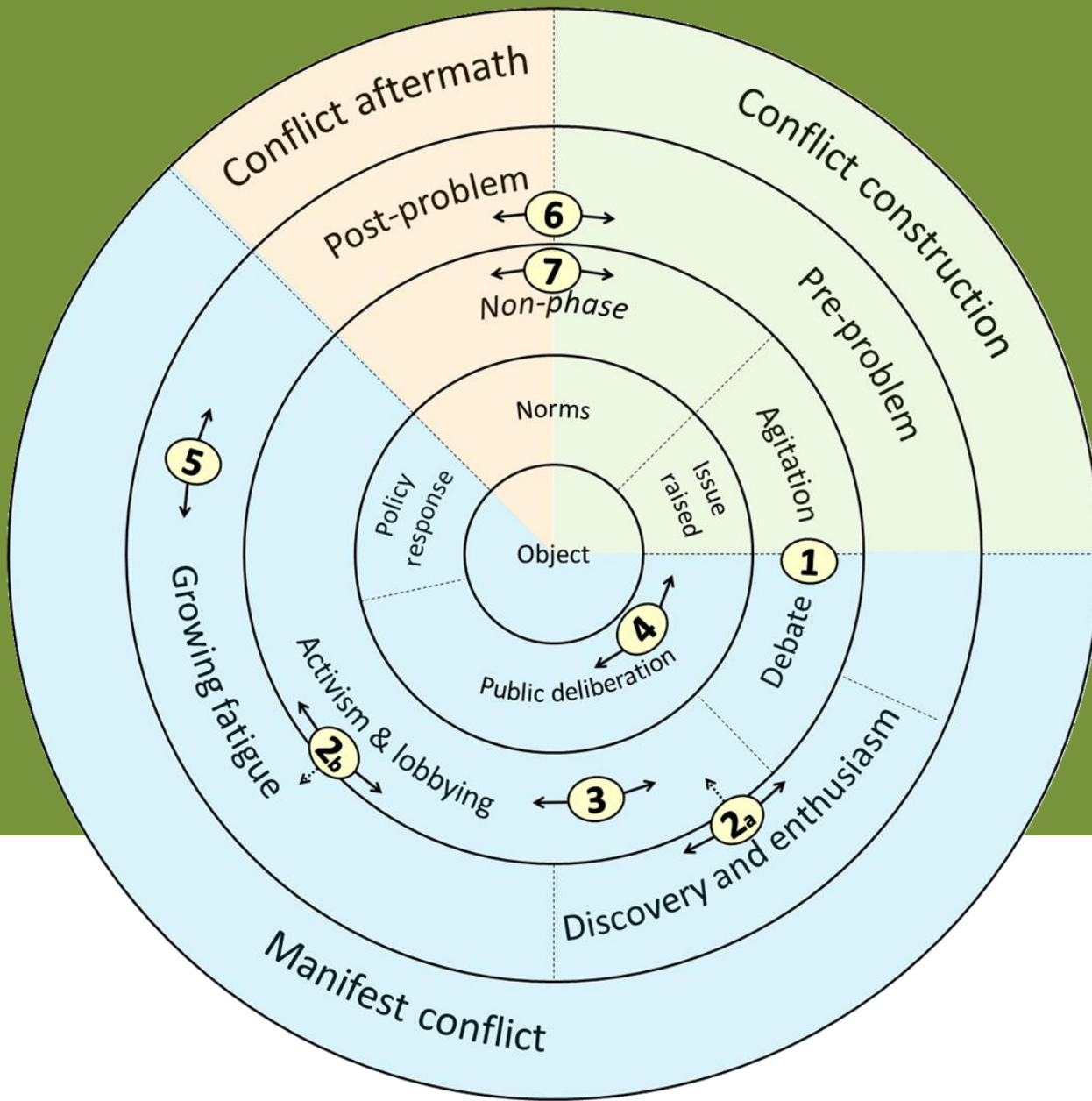
