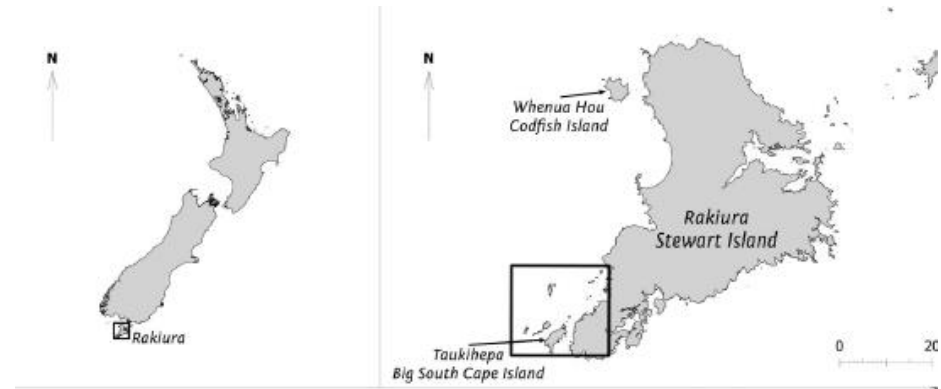

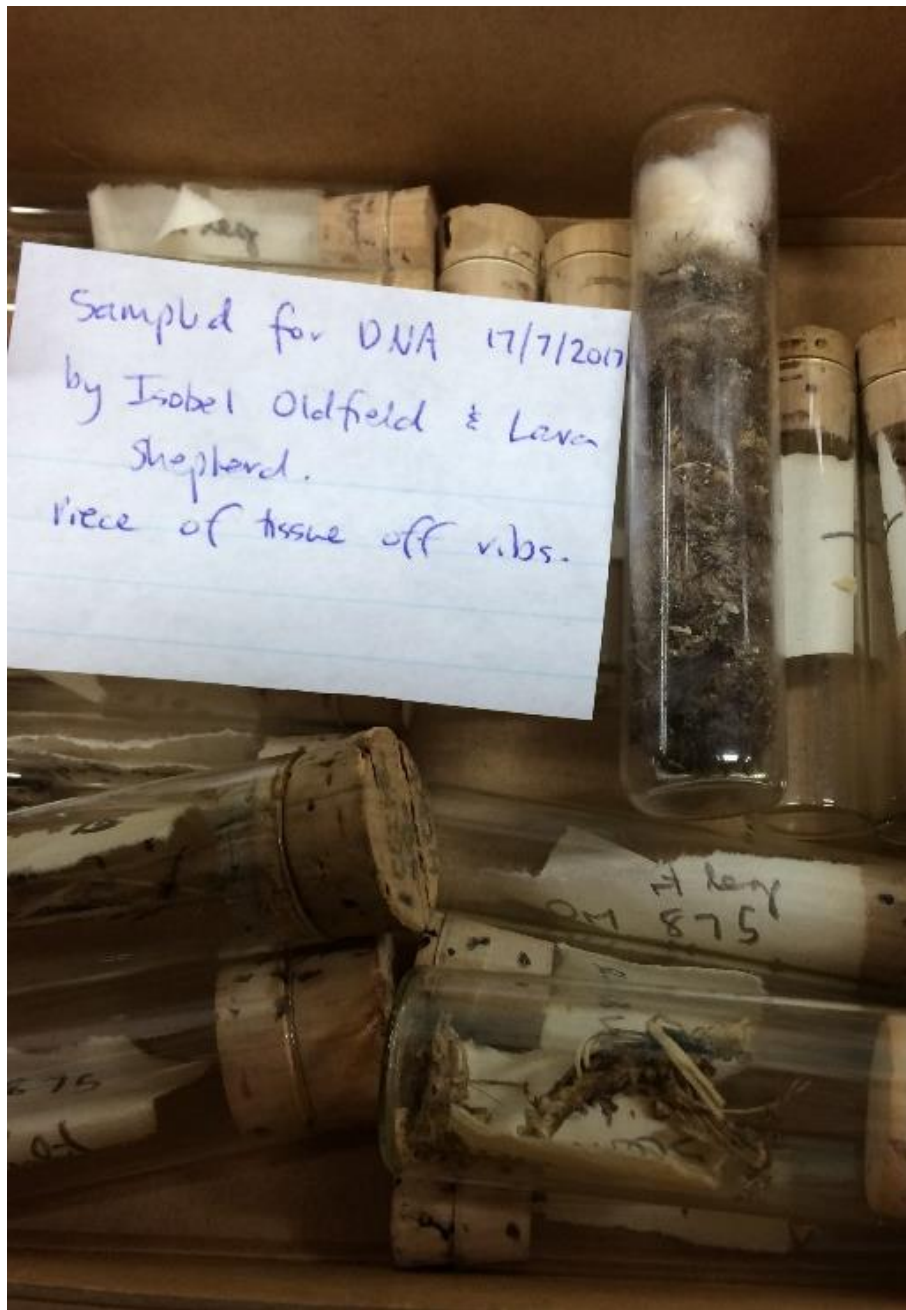
Masters in International Nature Conservation

Fiordland National Park

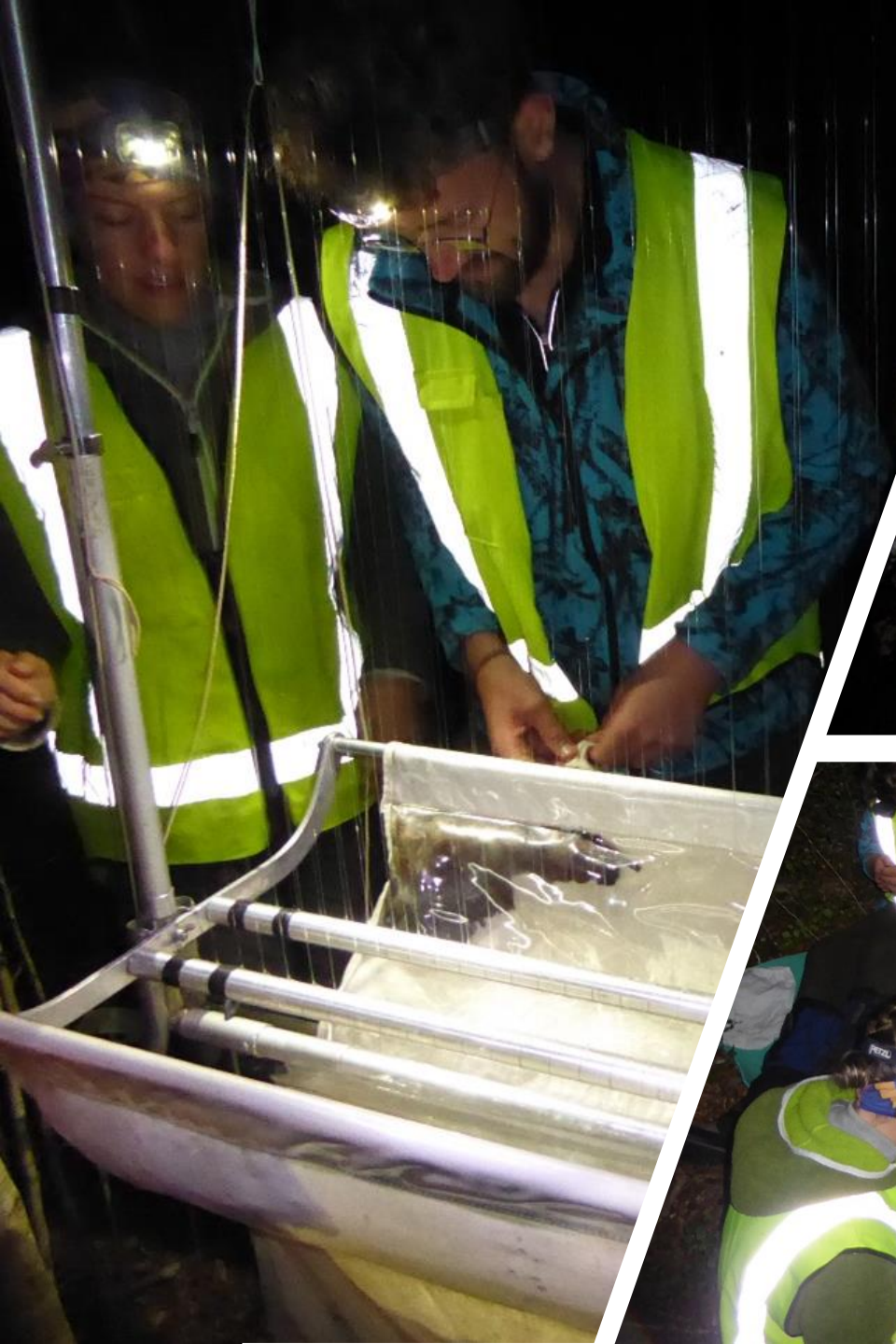
- Mark and recapture programme running in Fiordland National Park for 25 years
