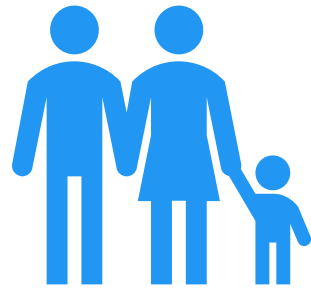

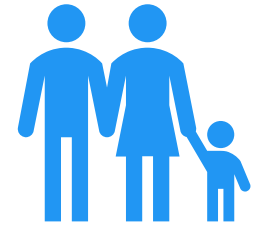

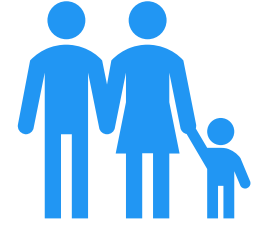

People: Social Impact Assessments

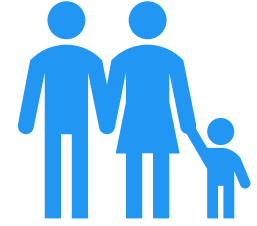


A response to community concern about the gap in assessing social impacts

Aim: to improve the balance between the social, economic and environmental aspects of decision-making.



People: Community Participation Plans

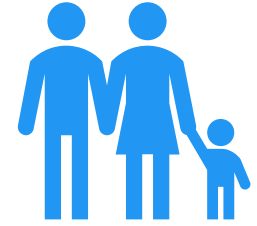


Community Participation:

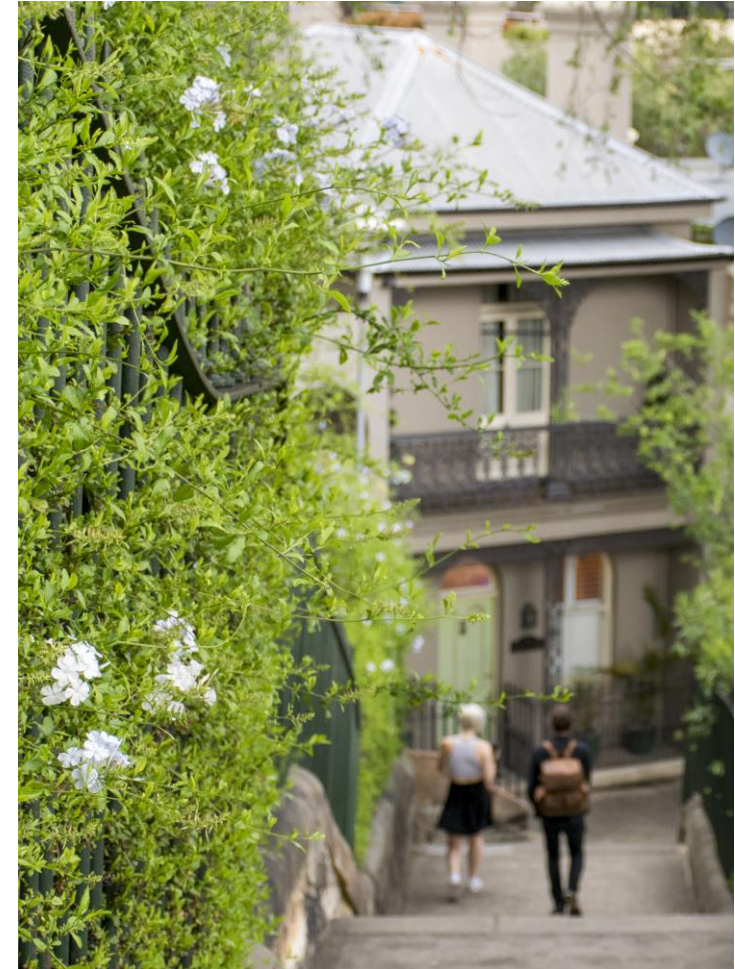


Better Placed:

Power: *BASIX*



- 40% reduction in potable water consumption



- 50% reduction in greenhouse gas emissions



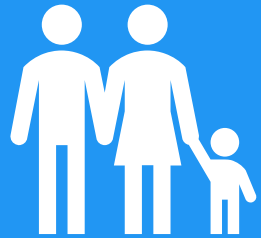
- Save 83 gigawatt hours energy annually
 - Totalling \$2.6 billion in bills to 2050

Power: Electric Vehicles



- Support cleaner energy and reduce emissions
- Low running and maintenance costs
- Quieter than conventional vehicles
- Can be used to support energy security.
