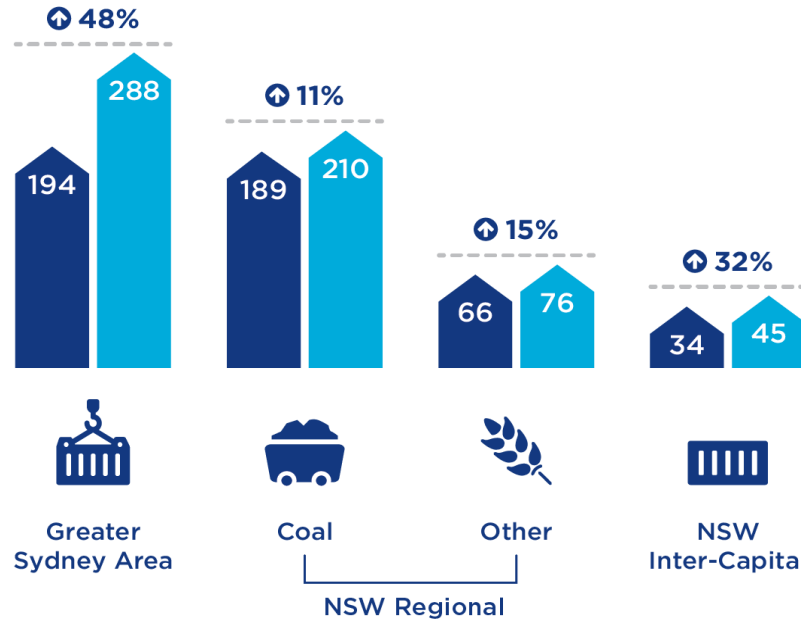

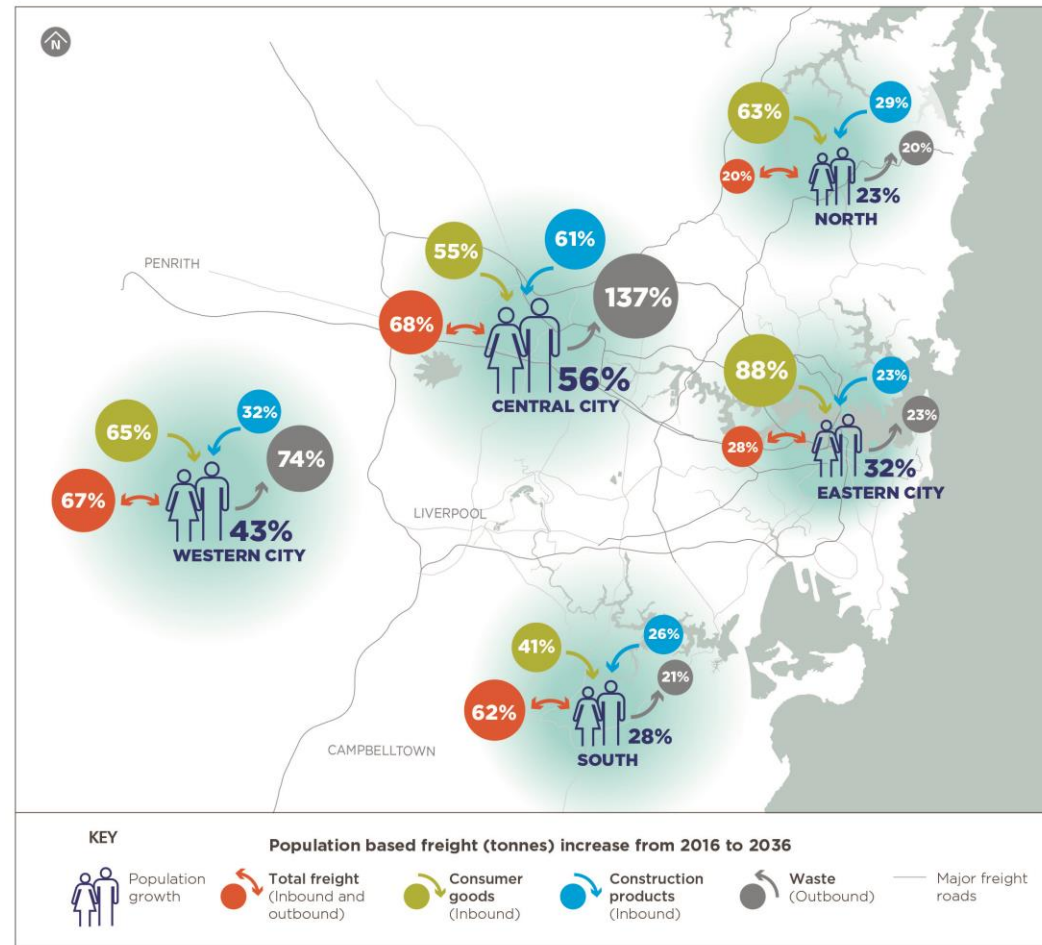

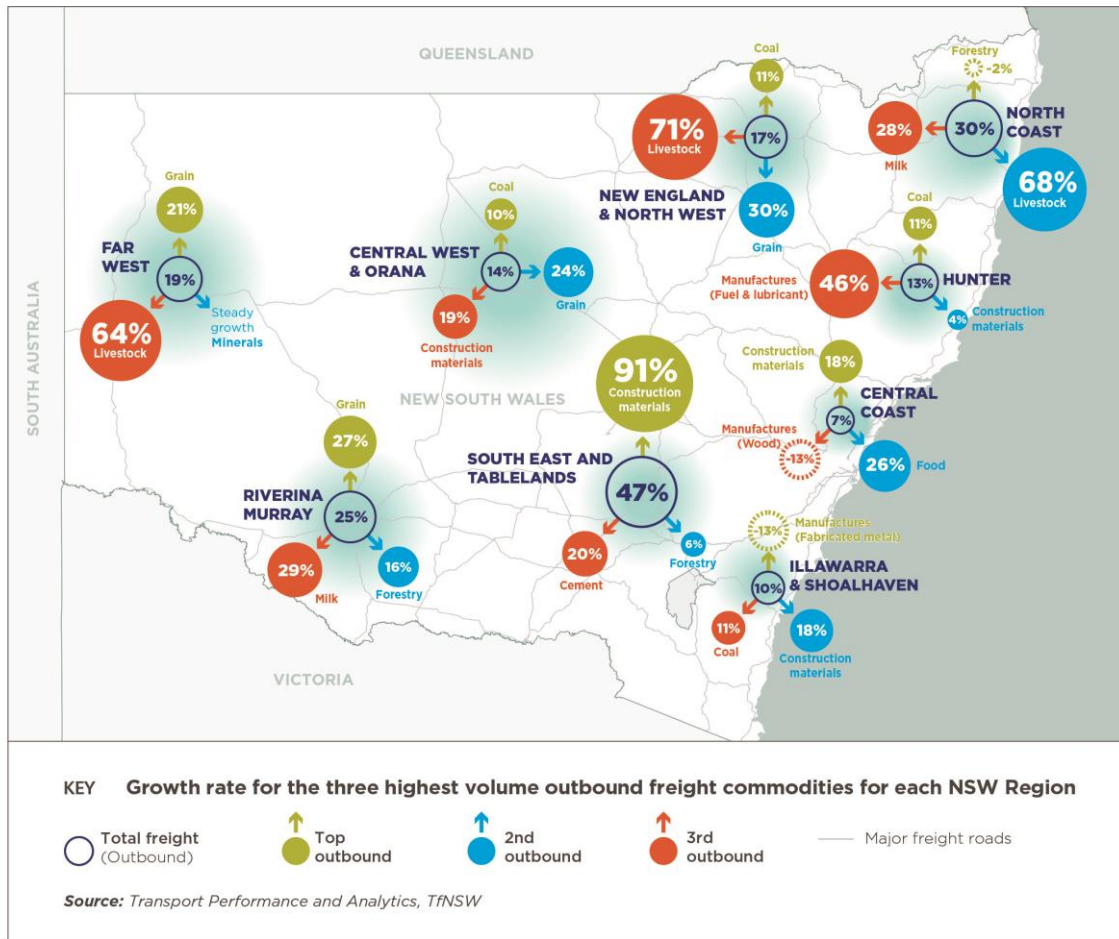
Greater Sydney

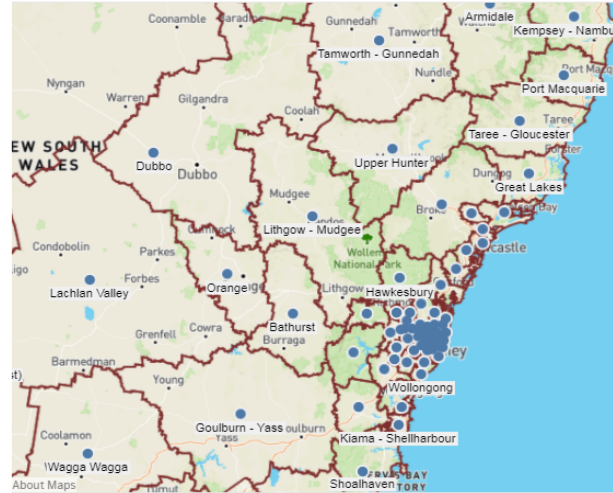

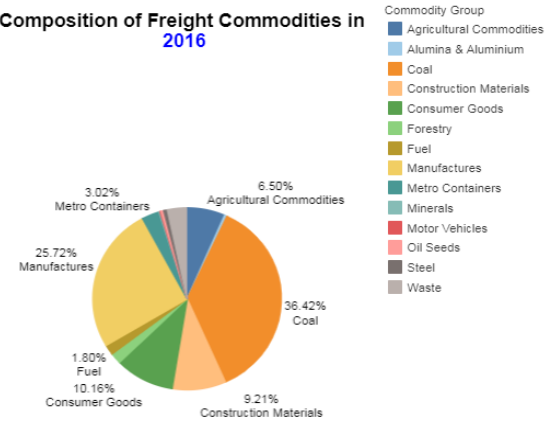

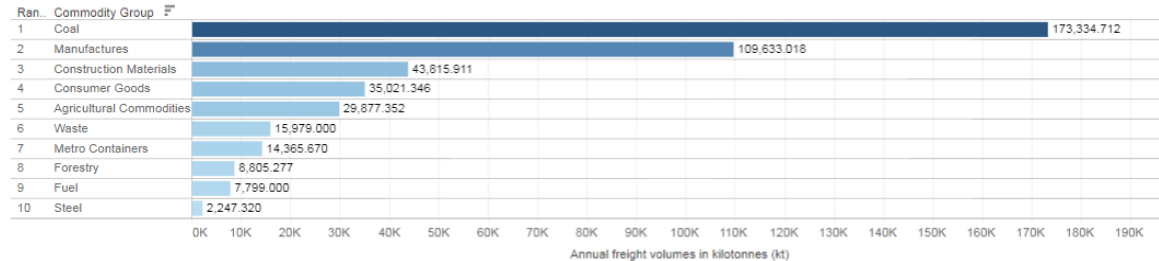
