Eric Anderson Award

This award is for the best article published in the Australasian Journal of Environmental Management during the year and is decided by the Journal editors.

The winners of this award are Mr. Abdulrasheed Zakari, Dr. Irfan Khan, Assoc. Prof. Rafael Alvarado and Dr. Ibtissem Missaoui for their article, 'The Impact of Renewable Energy Rebates on Environmental Sustainability in Australia', *Australasian Journal of Environmental Management*, 31:1, pp. 108-125.

The article makes significant contributions by evaluating the effectiveness of renewable energy policies, particularly premium feed-in tariffs (FiTs) and the Renewable Energy Target (RET) in reducing carbon emissions in Australia. The study demonstrates that while FiTs are effective in driving long-term reductions in carbon emissions, they present challenges in the short term. On the other hand, the RET policy is found to consistently reduce emissions in both the short and long term. These findings underscore the importance of well-designed policy frameworks that balance immediate challenges with long-term sustainability goals, offering valuable insights for policymakers aiming to enhance environmental outcomes through strategic incentives for renewable energy.
